Lunar New Year Animal Exploration

Use this guide to learn about Lunar New Year 2023: The Year of the Rabbit and to locate works of art in the galleries.

The Lunar New Year occurs each year between January 21 and February 19. In 2023, the first day of lunar New Year is celebrated on January 22 with festivities continuing in China until the Lantern Festival which celebrates the first full moon of the New Year on February 5. Unless noted, the animals in this list are on view in the Chinese galleries.

The Tiger, Rabbit, Dragon, Snake, Horse, Ram, Monkey, Rooster, Dog, Boar, Rat and Ox form a 12-year cycle. According to a Chinese legend, the twelve animals quarreled as to who was to head the cycle of years. It was decided that a contest would be held to decide the sequence of years. The first animal to reach the other side of the riverbank would have the first year of the lunar calendar named after them, and the rest of the animals would receive their years according to their finish. All the twelve animals gathered at the river bank and jumped in. Unknown to the ox, the rat had jumped upon his back. As the ox was about to step ashore, the rat sprung off the ox's back, and won the race. The lazy pig was last. Therefore, the rat is the first year of the animal cycle, the ox second, and the pig/boar last.

Monkey (1932 - 1944 - 1956 - 1968 - 1980 - 1992 - 2004 - 2016 - 2028)


